### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This is a refiled bill from the 19th Congress, where it was principally authored by Hon. Xavier Jesus D. Romualdo during the 18<sup>th</sup> Congress. It now incorporates developments in the legal support field and considers inputs from key stakeholders, including legal education institutions and civil society groups advocating for justice reform.

This measure seeks to institutionalize the paralegal profession and its practice, including the creation of a Professional Regulatory Board for Paralegals under the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC).

Paralegals play a critical role in the delivery of legal services in both public and private sectors. However, despite the growing reliance on their expertise in legal research, documentation, case preparation, and procedural compliance, the paralegal profession remains unregulated in the Philippines.

It is high time that Congress institutionalize the paralegal profession, recognizing existing qualified practitioners and encouraging more individuals to pursue this profession with appropriate training, licensure, and recognition. Establishing a regulatory framework for paralegals will not only elevate the standards of legal support work in the country but also ensure accountability, competence, and ethical conduct within the practice.

By professionalizing this sector, the country will benefit from a stronger pool of skilled professionals capable of performing substantive legal work—ultimately easing the burden on lawyers and increasing access to legal assistance for more Filipinos. Furthermore, this will foster more competitive compensation and career development for paralegals, in line with the quality of their contributions.

The passage of this bill is a step toward strengthening our legal institutions, expanding access to justice, and creating more professional opportunities for Filipinos.

The support of the Members of the House for the immediate and favorable passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

**AN ACT**

**PROFESSIONALIZING PARALEGAL PRACTICE IN THE PHILIPPINES, CREATING FOR THIS PURPOSE A PROFESSIONAL REGULATORY BOARD FOR PARALEGALS, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:*

**ARTICLE I**

**Title, Declaration of Policy, and Objectives**

**SECTION 1. Title.** - This Act shall be known as the “Philippine Paralegal Act of 2021.”

**SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy.** - The State recognizes the importance of professional paralegals in nation building and development. Hence, it shall develop and nurture competent, virtuous, productive, and well-rounded professional paralegals whose standards of practice and service shall be excellent and globally competitive through honest, effective, relevant, and credible licensure examinations and through regulatory programs, measures, and activities that foster their professional growth, social responsibility, and development.

**SEC. 3. Objectives.** - This Act shall govern the following:

- a. National licensure examination, registration of paralegals, and issuance of certificates of registration and professional identification cards;
- b. Supervision, control, and regulation of paralegal practice;
- c. Integration of paralegals under one national organization; and
- d. Development of professional competence of paralegals.

1 **ARTICLE II**

2 **Definition of Term and Scope of the Practice**

3 **SEC. 4. Definition of Paralegal.** - As used in this Act, a paralegal is a person who is not  
4 a member of the Philippine Bar and who by education, training, or experience, performs  
5 substantive legal work requiring the recognition, evaluation, organization, analysis, and  
6 communication of relevant facts and legal concepts.

7  
8 **SEC. 5. Scope of the Practice of Paralegal Service.** - Paralegal service shall deal with  
9 the performance of the functions of the paralegal, which shall include the following:

- 10 a. Preparation and review of legal documents, such as affidavits, motions, and contracts;  
11 b. Representation on behalf of a party in small claims cases;  
12 c. Representation on behalf of a party in barangay conciliation proceedings;  
13 d. Investigation and fact-finding;  
14 e. Legal research;  
15 f. Development and review of organizational policies, procedures, programs, and other legal  
16 matters;  
17 g. Coordination with government agencies and courts; and  
18 h. Legal support for persons engaged in the practice of law.

19  
20 **ARTICLE III**

21 **Creation of the Professional Regulatory Board for Paralegals**

22  
23 **SEC. 6. Creation and Composition of the Professional Regulatory Board for**  
24 **Paralegals.** - There is hereby created a Professional Regulatory Board for Paralegals, hereinafter  
25 referred to as the Board, under the administrative supervision and control of the Professional  
26 Regulation Commission (PRC). The Board shall be comprised of a Chairperson and four (4)  
27 Members who shall be appointed by the President of the Philippines from the three (3) persons  
28 recommended for each position by the PRC, who, in turn, must be among the list of five (5)  
29 qualified nominees for each position submitted by the accredited and integrated national  
30 professional organization of paralegals. The Board shall be constituted within three (3) months  
31 from the effectivity of this Act.

32  
33 **SEC. 7. Qualifications of Chairperson and Members of the Board.** - The Chairperson  
34 and Members of the Board must possess the following qualifications:

- 35 a. A natural born citizen and resident of the Philippines;  
36 b. Of good reputation and moral character;  
37 c. A practicing paralegal;  
38 d. Not a member of the faculty of a university, college, school, or institution conferring

1 the academic degree on legal management and paralegal studies or offering review  
2 classes for the paralegal licensure examination, nor has a direct or indirect pecuniary  
3 interest in any such institution; and

- 4 e. Not an incumbent officer of the accredited and integrated national professional  
5 organization of paralegals.  
6

7 **SEC. 8. Tenure of Office for the Chairperson and Members of the Board.** - The  
8 Chairperson and the Members of the Board shall hold office for a term of three (3) years from the  
9 date of their appointment or until their successors shall have been appointed: Provided, That the  
10 first Members appointed Board shall hold office for the following terms: one (1) member as  
11 Chairperson, to serve for three (3) years; two (2) Members, to serve for two (2) years; and two (2)  
12 Members, to serve for one (1) year. The Chairperson and the Members of the Board may be  
13 reappointed for a second term but in no case shall they serve continuously for more than six (6)  
14 years. Any vacancy in the Board shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term of the member  
15 who vacated the position. The Chairperson and Members of the Board shall take the proper oath  
16 of office prior to the assumption of duty. The first Chairperson and Members of the Board  
17 appointed shall automatically be registered and issued Certificates of Registration and Professional  
18 Identification Cards.  
19

20 **SEC. 9. Meetings of the Board.** The Board shall have a regular meeting once a month.  
21 Special meetings may also be held upon call of the Chairperson or by request of at least three (3)  
22 Members. Reasonable notice of all meetings shall be given in the manner prescribed by the rules  
23 of the Board.  
24

25 **SEC. 10. Compensation and Allowances of the Chairperson and Members of the**  
26 **Board.** - The Chairperson and the Members of the Board shall receive compensation and  
27 allowances comparable to the compensation and allowances received by the chairpersons and the  
28 members of existing professional regulatory boards under the Commission, as provided for in the  
29 General Appropriations Act.  
30

31 **SEC. 11. Powers, Functions, and Duties of the Board.** - The Board shall exercise  
32 executive, administrative, rule-making, and quasi-judicial powers in carrying out the provisions of  
33 this Act. It shall be vested with the following specific powers, functions, duties, and  
34 responsibilities:

- 35 a. Promulgate, administer, and enforce rules and regulations necessary to carry out the  
36 provisions of this Act;  
37 b. Prepare, adopt, issue or amend the syllabi or terms of specification of subjects for the  
38 paralegal licensure examination consistent with the policies and standards set by the

1 Commission on Higher Education (CHED);

- 2 c. Evaluate and approve applications for licensure examination;
- 3 d. Administer oaths and issue Certificates of Registration and the Professional  
4 Identification Card to persons admitted to the practice of the paralegal profession;
- 5 e. Prescribe guidelines in the Continuing Professional Development (CPD) in  
6 coordination with the accredited and integrated national professional organization of  
7 paralegals;
- 8 f. Recommend measures necessary for the upgrading, enhancement, development and  
9 growth of the paralegal profession in the Philippines;
- 10 g. Monitor the conditions affecting paralegal practice and, when necessary, adopt such  
11 measures as may be deemed proper for the enhancement and maintenance of high  
12 ethical, moral, and professional standards for paralegals;
- 13 h. Adopt and prescribe a Code of Professional Ethics and a Code of Technical Standards  
14 for paralegals;
- 15 i. Conduct inspection and monitoring of establishments where the paralegal profession is  
16 practiced, and of higher educational institutions where paralegal courses are being  
17 offered, in coordination CHED, to ascertain that professional standards are complied  
18 with;
- 19 j. Ensure, in coordination with CHED, that all institutions offering legal management and  
20 paralegal studies comply with prescribed standards for curriculum, faculty, and  
21 facilities;
- 22 k. Supervise and regulate the registration, licensure, and practice of paralegals in the  
23 Philippines;
- 24 l. Adopt a program for the full computerization of the licensure examination for  
25 paralegals;
- 26 m. Issue, reinstate, suspend, or revoke the Certificate of Registration and Professional  
27 Identification Card or grant or cancel a temporary /special permit;
- 28 n. Issue Certificates of Recognition for advanced studies, researches  
29 and accomplishments that contribute to the enrichment of the profession;
- 30 o. Adopt policies and set the standards for all types of paralegals; and
- 31 p. To discharge other powers and duties as the Board may deem necessary for the  
32 paralegal practice and the continued growth and development of paralegals and  
33 paralegal education in the Philippines .

34  
35 The policies, resolutions, rules and regulations issued or promulgated by the Board shall  
36 be subject to review and approval of the Commission. However, the Board's decision, resolution,  
37 or order rendered in administrative cases shall be subject to review only on appeal.

38 **SEC. 12. Removal or Suspension of the Chairperson or Members of the Board.** - The

1 Chairperson or any Member of the Board may be suspended or removed upon due notice and  
2 hearing by the President of the Philippines, upon the recommendation of the Commission, for  
3 neglect of duty, abuse of power, oppression, incompetence, unprofessional, unethical, immoral, or  
4 dishonorable conduct, commission or toleration of irregularities in the conduct of examination or  
5 tampering of the grades therein, or for any final judgment or conviction of any criminal offense  
6 involving moral turpitude. The rights of Chairperson and Members to be due process and to be  
7 assisted by counsel shall be respected in the proper administrative proceedings to be conducted for  
8 the purpose.

9  
10 **SEC. 13. Supervision of the Board, Custodian of Its Records, Secretariat, and**  
11 **Support Services.** - The Board shall be under the general supervision and administrative control  
12 of the Commission. All records of the Board, including applications for examination, examination  
13 papers and results, minutes of deliberations, administrative and other investigative cases involving  
14 paralegals, shall be kept by the Commission. The Commission shall designate the secretary of the  
15 Board and shall provide the secretariat and other support services to implement the provisions of  
16 this Act subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

17  
18 **SEC. 14. Annual Report.** - The Board shall, at the close of each fiscal year, submit an  
19 annual report to the Commission, giving a detailed account of its proceedings and  
20 accomplishments during the year and recommending measures to be adopted with the end- in-view  
21 of upgrading and improving the conditions affecting paralegal practice in the Philippines.

## 22 23 **ARTICLE IV**

### 24 **Licensure Examination and Registration**

25 **SEC. 15. Licensure Examination.** - Applicants for registration, except those specifically  
26 allowed under Section 22 of this Act, shall be required to undergo a written licensure examination  
27 to be given by the Board in such places and dates the Commission may designate subject to  
28 compliance with the requirements prescribed by the Commission.

29  
30 **SEC. 16. Qualifications for Examination.** -Applicants for licensure examination must  
31 meet the following qualifications at the time of filing of applications:

- 32 a. Citizen and resident of the Philippines: Provided, that citizen of a foreign country may  
33 be allowed to take the examination, subject to the requirement of reciprocity pursuant  
34 to Section 31 of this Act;
- 35 b. Possesses good moral character and must not have been convicted of any crime  
36 involving moral turpitude;
- 37 c. Graduate of a Bachelor's degree conferred by a school, college, or university  
38 recognized and duly accredited by CHED: Provided, That six (6) years after the

1 effectivity of this Act, only the graduates of the following degrees shall be allowed to  
2 qualify for application to the licensure examination:

- 3 1. Bachelor of Science in Legal Management;
- 4 2. Bachelor of Science in Paralegal Studies; and
- 5 3. Any bachelor's degree in arts and sciences with at least eighteen (18) units in  
6 professional paralegal practice.

7  
8 All applications for examination shall be filed with the Board which shall assess and  
9 approve said applications and issue to the qualified examinees the corresponding permits to take  
10 such examination.

11  
12 **SEC. 17. Scope of Examination.** -The licensure examination shall cover, but not be  
13 limited to, the following subjects:

- 14 a. Government;
- 15 b. The Judicial system;
- 16 c. Civil, criminal, and quasi-judicial procedures;
- 17 d. Jurisdiction of local government units;
- 18 e. Ethical standards of paralegals;
- 19 f. Obligations and commercial contracts;
- 20 g. Tax and labor law compliance; and
- 21 h. Rules, regulations and procedures of various administrative agencies.

22  
23 The Board may also re-cluster, rearrange, modify, add, or exclude any of the foregoing  
24 subjects as the need arises and may recommend to CHED changes in said subjects to conform to  
25 developments in the paralegal profession.

26  
27 **SEC. 18. Rating in the Examination.** - To pass the licensure examination, a candidate  
28 must obtain a passing rating of seventy five percent (75%) in each subject given during the  
29 examination; Provided, however, That an examinee who obtains a passing rating in the majority  
30 of the subjects but obtains a rating in the other subjects below seventy five percent (75%) but not  
31 lower than sixty percent (60%), shall be allowed to take one removal examination on the subjects  
32 where the passing rating was not obtained; Provided, finally, That should the examinee fail to  
33 obtain a passing rating in the removal examination, the examinee shall be considered as having  
34 failed the entire licensure examination .

35  
36 **SEC. 19. Report of Results of Examination.** - The Board shall report to the Commission  
37 the results of the examination and the ratings of the examinees within sixty (60) days after the  
38 examination unless extended by the Commission for just and valid cause.

1  
2           **SEC. 20. Oath of Profession.** - All successful examinees qualified for registration and all  
3 qualified applicants for registration without examination shall be required to take an oath of  
4 profession before any Commission Officer, or Member of the Board or any government official  
5 authorized to administer oaths, prior to entering into paralegal practice in the Philippines.  
6

7           **SEC. 21. Issuance of Certificate of Registration and Professional Identification Card.**  
8 - The Commission, on recommendation of the Board, shall issue a Certificate of Registration and  
9 Professional Identification Card to each person who passed the licensure examination for  
10 paralegals and to those who are registered without examination under this Act and shall enter the  
11 name of the registered professional in the Roster of Paralegals. The Certificate of Registration shall  
12 bear the signature of the Chairperson of the Commission and the Chairperson and Members of the  
13 Board, stamped with official seals of the Board and Commission indicating that the person named  
14 therein is entitled to the practice of the profession with all the privileges appurtenant thereto. The  
15 said Certificate of Registration shall remain in full force and effect until suspended or revoked in  
16 accordance with this Act. A Professional Identification Card bearing the name and signature of the  
17 registrant, registration number, date of issuance, expiry date, duly signed by the Chairperson of  
18 the Commission, shall likewise be issued to every registrant who has paid the prescribed fee.  
19

20           **Section 22. Registration Without Examination.** - Upon application and payment of the  
21 required fees, the following shall be registered, and shall be issued by the Board and the  
22 Commission a Certificate of Registration and a Professional Identification Card without taking the  
23 prescribed examination:  
24

- 25           a. Those who, upon the effectivity of this Act, have been issued a certificate of completion of  
26 the Paralegal Training Program offered by the University of the Philippines Law Center  
27 and been a member of good standing of the Paralegal Training Program Alumni  
28 Association, Inc. for at least two (2) years;  
29
- 30           b. Those who, upon the effectivity of this Act, have been issued a certificate of completion of  
31 OPLAN Jail Decongestion spearheaded by the National Committee on Legal Aid (NCLA)  
32 of the Integrated Bar of the Philippines (IBP) and been providing paralegal services for at  
33 least (2) years;  
34
- 35           c. Those who, upon the effectivity of this Act, have been issued a certificate of completion of  
36 the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) paralegal program and been BJMP  
37 paralegal officers for at least two (2) years; and  
38
- 39           d. Those who, upon the effectivity of this Act, hold permanent appointments and have at least

1 two (2) years of actual experience in providing paralegal services.

- 2  
3 e. Those so exempt under the aforementioned categories shall file their application within  
4 two (2) years from the effectivity of this Act: Provided, That the renewal of their  
5 professional identification cards shall be subject to the provisions of Section 21 hereof.  
6

7 **SEC. 23. Refusal to Issue Certificate of Registration and Professional Identification**

8 **Card.** - The Board shall not register any successful examinee nor any applicant for registration  
9 without examination if he or she has been convicted by a court of competent jurisdiction of any  
10 criminal offense involving moral turpitude or has been found guilty of immoral and dishonorable  
11 conduct after investigation of the Board or has been declared to be of unsound mind. The reason  
12 for the refusal shall be set forth in writing.  
13

14 **SEC. 24. Revocation and Suspension of Certificate of Registration and Professional**  
15 **Identification Card or Cancellation of Temporary /Special Permit.** - The Board shall have the

16 power, after due notice and hearing, to revoke or suspend the Certificate of Registration or cancel  
17 a temporary or special permit of any paralegal on any of grounds under Section 23 of this Act, or  
18 for any of the following : unprofessional or dishonorable conduct in paralegal practice; fraud;  
19 deceit or falsification in obtaining a certificate of registration, professional identification card, or  
20 temporary/special permit; abetment of illegal practice by allowing illegal use of his/her Certificate  
21 of Registration, or Professional Identification Card, or temporary or special permit; practice of  
22 profession during the period of suspension; or any violation of this Act, its Implementing Rules  
23 and Regulations, the Code of Ethics or the Code of Technical Standards for Paralegals, or Board  
24 policies. The respondent may appeal the Board's decision, order or resolution to the Commission  
25 within fifteen (15) days from receipt thereof.  
26

27 **SEC. 25. Reissuance of Revoked Certificate of Registration and Replacement of Lost**  
28 **Certificate of Registration and Professional Identification Card.** - The Board after two (2)  
29 years from the date of revocation of the Certificate of Registration may reissue a certificate upon  
30 proper application. A new Certificate of Registration and Professional Identification Card, or  
31 temporary or special permit, which has been lost, destroyed or mutilated, may be reissued after  
32 payment of the required fee prescribed by the Commission.  
33

34 **SEC. 26. Roster of Paralegals.** - The Board, in coordination with the accredited and  
35 integrated national organization of paralegals, shall maintain an up-to-date, complete and properly  
36 organized Roster containing the following data:

- 37 a. alphabetical list by surname of paralegals with their addresses and license numbers;  
38 b. the list of licensees, numerically arranged by license numbers; and

1 c. such other lists which the Board may deem necessary.

2 Copies of the Roster, which shall be provided to the National Library, the Civil Service  
3 Commission, and the accredited national organization of paralegals, shall be kept as a permanent  
4 record.

## 6 ARTICLE V

### 7 Paralegal Practice

8 **SEC. 27. Prohibitions and Limitations in the Paralegal Practice.** - No person shall  
9 practice or offer to practice as a paralegal in the Philippines or offer oneself as a paralegal, or use  
10 the title, word, letter, figure, or any sign tending to convey the impression that one is a paralegal  
11 or advertise or indicate in any manner whatsoever as qualified to perform the work of a paralegal  
12 unless the person satisfactorily passed the licensure examination given by the Board, except as  
13 otherwise provided in this Act, and is a holder of a valid certificate of registration and a valid  
14 professional license or a valid temporary special permit duly issued by the Board and the  
15 Commission .

16  
17 **SEC. 28. Other Prohibited Acts.** - No person shall:

- 18 a. Represent oneself as a paralegal during the time that the professional license is not  
19 valid, or that the Certificate of Registration has been suspended or revoked, or that the  
20 temporary special permit is cancelled;
- 21 b. Allow another person to use one's Certificate of Registration and/or professional  
22 license or temporary special permit as a paralegal to enable the person to engage in the  
23 practice of paralegal;
- 24 c. Use the Certificate of Registration or professional license or special temporary permit  
25 of another paralegal.

26  
27 **SEC. 29. Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Program.** - The CPD guidelines  
28 shall be prescribed and promulgated by the Commission upon consultation with the Board, which  
29 shall consult the integrated APO of paralegals, affiliated association of paralegals, and other  
30 concerned sectors. The Board shall create a CPD Council that shall be composed of a Chairperson  
31 coming from the Board, a member from the APO of paralegal and a member from the academe.

32 **SEC. 30. Integration of Paralegals.** - All paralegals shall be integrated into one (1)  
33 national organization, which shall be recognized by the Board and by the Commission as the one  
34 and only integrated APO of paralegals. A paralegal duly registered with the Board shall  
35 automatically become a member of the integrated APO of paralegal, and shall receive the benefits  
36 and privileges thereto, upon payment of the required fees and dues. Membership in the integrated  
37 APO shall not be a bar to membership in other associations of paralegals.

38 **SEC. 31. Foreign Reciprocity.** - No foreign paralegal shall be admitted to the licensure

1 examination, or be given a certificate of registration and a professional license, or be entitled to  
2 any of the privileges under this Act, unless the country of which he or she is a subject or citizen  
3 specifically permits Filipino paralegal to practice within its territorial limits under the same  
4 conditions and an equal basis as its own subjects or citizens.

5  
6 **SEC. 32. Indication of License and Privilege Tax Receipt.** - A paralegal shall be required  
7 to indicate the registration or professional number and date of issuance, the duration of validity,  
8 including the Professional Tax Receipt number on the documents one signs, or issues in connection  
9 with the practice of the profession.

## 10 **ARTICLE VI**

### 11 **Penal and Final Provisions**

12  
13 **SEC. 33. Penal Provisions.** - Any violation of this Act, including violations of its  
14 Implementing Rules and Regulations, shall be meted the penalty of a fine of not less than fifty  
15 thousand pesos (P50,000.00) but not more than five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00) or  
16 imprisonment of not less than six (6) months but not more than four (4) years, or both such fine  
17 and imprisonment upon the discretion of the court. In case the violation is committed by an  
18 unlicensed paralegal, the penalty shall be double the aforesaid fine and imprisonment.

19  
20 In case the violation is committed by a partnership, corporation, association, or any other  
21 juridical person, the partner, president, director, or manager who has committed or consented to or  
22 knowingly tolerated such violation shall be held directly liable and responsible for the acts as  
23 principal or as a co-principal with the other participants, if any.

24 **SEC. 34. Appropriations.** - The Chairperson of the Commission shall immediately  
25 include in the Commission 's programs the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall  
26 be included in the annual General Appropriations Act and thereafter.

27  
28 **SEC. 35. Implementing Rules and Regulations.** - Within six (6) months after the  
29 effectivity of this Act, the Board, subject to the approval of the Commission, shall promulgate,  
30 adopt, and issue rules and regulations, and the Code of Ethics and the Code of Technical Standards  
31 for Paralegals which shall take effect fifteen (15) days following publication in the official Gazette  
32 or newspaper of general circulation.

33  
34 **SEC. 36. Separability Clause.** - If any clause, sentence, paragraph, or part of this Act shall  
35 be declared invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid  
36 and subsisting.

37  
38 **SEC. 37. Repealing Clause.** - All laws, presidential decrees or issuances, executive orders,

1 letters of instruction, administrative orders, proclamations, charters, rules, or regulations, or parts  
2 thereof, contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, modified,  
3 or amended accordingly.

4  
5 **SEC. 38. Transitory Provision.** - All incumbent paralegals in both the public and private  
6 sector not otherwise certified as paralegals by virtue of this Act shall be given six (6) years  
7 temporary certificates from the time the Board is organized within to qualify as required of this  
8 Act and be included in the Roster.

9  
10 **SEC. 39. Effectivity Clause.** - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its  
11 publication in the Official Gazette or a newspaper of general circulation.

12  
13 **Approved,**
