EXPLANATORY NOTE

In 2022, the Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality of Taysan, Province of Batangas requested the former 4th District of Batangas, through Resolution no. 2022-N026 dated August 15, 2022, to sponsor a bill declaring November 11 of every year as a special (non-working) holiday in celebration of the founding anniversary of Taysan.

According to the National Historical Commission of the Philippines, it was on November 11, 1918 when Governor-General Francis Burton Harrison signed Executive Order no. 43, declaring the Municipality of Taysan as independent from the Municipality of Rosario, Batangas.

This bill was filed in the 19th Congress however, it was not able to pass the hurdles of legislation within this august chamber. As such, this representation refiled the bill which was drafted with the best interests of my constituency in mind and in line with my legislative priorities.

Declaring the day as a special (non-working) holiday in Taysan will allow its people to celebrate in a meaningful way the history and milestones that the town has achieved over the years.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate enactment and approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

INTRODUCED BY HONORABLE AMADO CARLOS BOLILIA IV

AN ACT
DECLARING NOVEMBER 11 OF EVERY YEAR AS A SPECIAL
(NON-WORKING) HOLIDAY IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TAYSAN, PROVINCE
OF BATANGAS, IN CELEBRATION OF ITS FOUNDING ANNIVERSARY

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress Assembled:

SECTION 1. November 11 of every year is hereby declared a special (non-working) holiday in the Municipality of Taysan, Province of Batangas, in celebration of its founding anniversary.

SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
