EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to declare Lake Apo located in Barangay Guinoyoran, City of Valencia, Province of Bukidnon, as a responsible, community-based ecotourism zone with the goals of developing and promoting the areas into a community-based ecological tourist destination, generating investments, creating livelihood opportunities, and protecting the natural resources within the area.

Found in Barangay Guinoyoran, City of Valencia, Lake Apo is a rift lake, fashioned in a circular shape atop a mountain floor due mainly to the movement of the earth's crust. This serene lake has a beautiful backdrop of hills and mountains and greenery. It is hailed as a clean and green inland body of water in Northern Mindanao and was awarded the Cleanest Lake in Region 10 in the late 1990s. This 24-hectare lake has a depth ranging from 17 to 26 meters where species of fish thrive.

In anticipation of the influx of local and foreign tourists, this bill, when enacted into law, will help secure adequate national support for the local government units (LGUs) to realize its vast potential as an eco-tourism zone that is ecologically sustainable, responsible, participative, culturally sensitive, economically viable and ethically and socially equitable for the local community.

Furthermore, the enactment of this bill into law will effectively fast-track the construction and improvement of roads and bridges, and other infrastructure projects necessary to make the area accessible and convenient to all, especially the tourists.

This bill was previously filed by this representation in the 19th Congress and was approved by the House of Representatives on Third Reading and transmitted to the Senate for its concurrence. However, due to lack of material time it was not passed into law.

Given the above premises, the urgent passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT
DECLARING LAKE APO, LOCATED IN BARANGAY GUINOYORAN, CITY
OF VALENCIA, PROVINCE OF BUKIDNON, AN ECOTOURISM ZONE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. The Lake Apo located in Barangay Guinoyoran, City of Valencia, Province of Bukidnon, is hereby declared an ecotourism zone. Pursuant thereto, its development shall be prioritized and supported by the Department of Tourism (DOT), subject to the rules and regulations governing the development of ecotourism zones.

SEC. 2. Within one (1) year after the approval of this Act, the local government of the City of Valencia shall, in coordination with the DOT, Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) and concerned agencies of the government, prepare a tourism development plan that shall include the construction, installation and maintenance of such appropriate infrastructure and facilities to enhance tourism in the area: *Provided*, That said development plan shall ensure the preservation and conservation of the natural beauty and resources of the area: *Provided*, further, That the

implementation of the tourism development plan shall be included in the budget of the local government of the City of Valencia.

SEC. 3. The DOT shall assist the local government of the City of Valencia in the implementation of the tourism development plan by providing technical assistance in tourism capacity building. It shall also include Lake Apo in its national and regional promotion programs.

SEC. 4. The funding for the implementation of this Act shall be included in the annual budget of the local government of the City of Valencia. The DOT may augment such allocation with internally-generated funds.

SEC. 5. Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, the local government of the City of Valencia shall, in consultation with the DOT and concerned agencies of the government, promulgate rules and regulations to implement this Act.

SEC. 6. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
