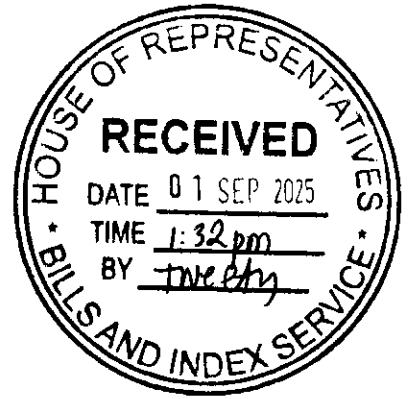

House Resolution No. 216

**A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE CONGRESSIONAL
INFRASTRUCTURE COMMITTEE (INFRACOM) TO INCLUDE IN
THE ONGOING INVESTIGATION IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ALL
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS (DPWH)
FLOOD CONTROL PROJECTS IN LAS PIÑAS FROM 2022 TO 2025**

WHEREAS, his Excellency, President Ferdinand “Bongbong” Marcos Jr., has directed a full and comprehensive investigation into questionable infrastructure and flood control projects to ensure transparency, accountability, and the proper utilization of public funds;

WHEREAS, it has been revealed that the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) poured a staggering ₱2.2 billion into thirty-nine (39) questionable flood control projects into the City of Las Piñas from 2022 to 2025;

WHEREAS, despite these allocations, severe flooding continues to plague Las Piñas, raising serious doubts as to the effectiveness and integrity of the said projects;

WHEREAS, it has been confirmed that the Las Piñas–Muntinlupa District Engineering Office allocated ₱437.1 million for flood control projects since 2022, not including several other multi-million peso infrastructure projects whose impact on residents remains lacking and questionable;

WHEREAS, it has been further exposed that in 2023, the DPWH allocated ₱572.9 million for nine flood control projects, with the largest contracts cornered by a few select contractors, with indicators of possible collusion and conflict of interest;

WHEREAS, in 2024, another ₱807.1 million was poured into ten flood control projects in Las Piñas, and in 2025, eight more projects were initiated with a combined budget of ₱417.2 million, yet records from the DPWH reveal delays and unfinished work, such as the ₱101.8-million project in Barangay Talon 2, which has only reached 33.98 percent completion as of June 2025;

WHEREAS, these anomalies constitute not just a misuse of public funds, but a direct disservice to the people of Las Piñas, who continue to suffer from flooding despite billions being spent on supposed infrastructure;

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need to delineate the scope of the ongoing investigation to ensure that it includes these questionable flood control projects in Las Piñas, in line with the President's directive, so that accountability may be upheld and justice served for Filipinos and Las Piñeros;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to include all Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) flood control projects in Las Piñas from 2022 to 2025 in the upcoming investigations on the flood control projects controversy to be led by the infrastructure committee (InfraCom), as directed by President Ferdinand Marcos Jr., and to summon concerned DPWH officials, contractors, and other responsible parties to shed light on the alleged anomalies, inefficiencies, and possible irregularities in the planning, allocation, and implementation of said projects.
