On motion of Representative Yap (J.G.), the Chair suspended the session at 3:54 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session was resumed at 3:56 p.m. with Deputy Speaker Ronaldo V. Puno presiding.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Upon the request of Rep. Bella Vanessa B. Suansing, the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of his guests.

Likewise, upon the request of Rep. Johanne Monich G. Bautista, the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Rep. Ricardo S. Cruz Jr. led by former Representative and now Taguig City Mayor Maria Laarni Cayetano, together with Vice Mayor Arvin Ian Alit and former House Secretary General and now Taguig City Administrator Jose Luis G. Moreover, upon the request of Representative Bautista, the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of former Senator and Secretary of Foreign Affairs Alberto Romulo and his wife Lovely Romulo, who were the guests of Reps. Antonino G. Calixto and Jaime R. Fresnedi; as well as the guests of Rep. Rosemarie Conejos Panotes.

PRIVILEGE HOUR

The day being a Monday, on motion of Rep. Alyssa Michaela “Mica” M. Gonzales, there being no objection, the Chair declared a Privilege Hour and thereafter, recognized Rep. Sergio C. Dagooc for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE DAGOOC

At the outset, Representative Dagooc recalled the liberalization of the airline industry in 1992 through Executive Order (E.O.) No. 219. He stated that while it was a bold move to break monopolies, encourage competition, and lower fares for ordinary citizens, it resulted in unintended consequences and problems not just for nameless passengers but for himself as well. He mentioned concerns like frequent flight cancellations, sudden changes in flight schedules without prior notice or passenger consent, and exorbitant fares.

As he shared that he had sent a letter through the Civil Aeronautics Board (CAB) to bring to the concerned airline's attention his concern on the sudden cancellation of his flight without an advance notice, he lamented that the airline responded by citing its general terms and conditions of carriage, effectively claiming that passengers have no recourse since they agreed to these terms during booking. He argued that airline companies are exploiting deregulation, which leaves passengers with little to no protection despite the supposed passenger bill of rights. He said that his case was not isolated, citing data from CAB regarding the increase in domestic flight complaints and a 2023 Senate hearing that revealed over 3,000 public complaints filed against just a single airline, involving delays, cancellations, and rebookings done without proper notice or compensation. He called for urgent reforms and stronger regulatory enforcement to protect Filipino passengers and hold airline companies accountable.

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Puno relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Jefferson F. Khonghun.

Representative Dagooc further remarked that CAB has lost much of its regulatory power, and deregulation has been ineffective in penalizing abusive airline practices or enforcing service standards. As he questioned whether the current liberalization framework still serves the public or merely benefits a few airlines, he declared his intent to file a House resolution calling for an inquiry in aid of legislation on the current state of domestic and international civil aviation liberalization policy, with the end in view of strengthening consumer protection and promoting a fair, efficient, and reliable air transportation sector.

Representative Dagooc clarified that his speech was neither an attack on competition nor a call to return to a monopoly, but a demand for accountability. As he stressed that deregulation must fulfill its promise of better and more affordable service as a result of E.O. No. 219, he also asserted that if government regulatory agencies, such as CAB, are unable to respond effectively to complaints, then their budgetary relevance should also be questioned. He appealed to his colleagues in the House to take the matter seriously, as airline services affect legislators and the general public.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), the Chair recognized Rep. Ziaur-Rahman "Zia" Alonto Adiong for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ADIONG

As he supported Representative Dagooc's concerns over the poor services provided by airlines, sharing similar experiences as a frequent traveler to Mindanao, Representative Adiong raised the issue of involuntary offloading and the lack of passenger notification and transparency in such cases. In response, Representative Dagooc agreed that the issues raised by Representative Adiong, as well as other issues like last-minute gate changes and overcrowded shuttle buses, are all contributing to a poor travel experience. He criticized CAB for repeatedly citing deregulation as a reason for inaction, despite the existence of the passenger's bill of rights.

Both Members agreed on the need to revisit the country's airline deregulation policy. Representative Adiong emphasized that passengers deserve transparency, particularly in cases of delays or mechanical issues, and stressed that airline companies should disclose the real reasons for flight delays and cancellations to airline passengers so that the latter can avail certain rightful options to either rebook their cancelled or delayed flights, or to refund their tickets.

On the other hand, Representative Dagooc stated that Congress should address the issue by reviewing the current liberalization framework and considering the necessary amendments thereof to ensure transparency and accountability of airline companies. For his part, Representative Adiong urged the committee to which Representative Dagooc's speech would be referred, to prioritize hearings on the said issue.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

Subsequently, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), the Chair suspended the session at 4:43 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 4:44 p.m., the session was resumed.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE RODRIGUEZ (R.)

Recognized by the Chair on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), Rep. Rufus B.

Rodriguez explained the two legal principles that would apply in case of erring airlines, to wit: (1) a contract of carriage in which buying a ticket creates a binding obligation for airline carriers to ensure the safe transport of passengers as scheduled and any delay or cancellation thereof constitutes a violation, making airline companies civilly liable under the Civil Code of the Philippines; and (2) a contract of adhesion wherein airline ticket terms, often in fine prints, are not absolute defenses as Philippine courts have ruled that such contracts cannot shield them from responsibility even when passengers have little choice but to accept them.

Representative Rodriguez stated that passengers may seek redress through administrative proceedings against erring airlines upon investigation by CAB, and through a civil action for the violation of the contract of carriage. He noted, however, that airline passengers rarely pursue court cases due to the cost and time-consuming nature of these kinds of cases, despite the airlines' clear violations of the contract of carriage; hence the filing of administrative proceedings is more practicable. He expressed his support for Representative Dagooc's privilege speech and the referral to any committee for investigation regarding the matter but not to wait until the conduct of budget hearing for CAB.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE DAGOOC

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Dagooc and the interpellations thereon to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Upon the request of Representative Gonzales (A.), the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Rep. Aniela Bianca D. Tolentino as well as of Rep. Atty. Miro S. Quimbo.

At this point, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), the Chair recognized Rep. Gil "Kabarangay Jr" Acosta for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ACOSTA

Representative Acosta expressed alarm over a reported blazing light in the sky followed by a

an explosion near Puerto Princesa, Palawan on August 4, 2025 which, he said, was later confirmed by the Philippine Space Agency to have come from China's Long March 12 Rocket launch. While no reported injuries occurred, he pointed out that the incident endangered communities, aircraft, fishermen, and the Tubbataha reef. He further opined that the country must assert, firmly but respectfully, that its citizens' safety and the integrity of its sovereign territory must not be compromised.

He then highlighted China's extensive uninhabited or remote regions which could be utilized as their rocket drop zones for space debris rather than smaller countries like the Philippines which consist of densely populated islands and environmentally fragile regions. He further maintained that the persistent risk posed to the Philippines by foreign rocket debris is not just negligence but profoundly unjust.

Representative Acosta emphasized that his speech was not a call for confrontation but a call for accountability, transparency, and adherence to international space safety rules among regional partners in Asia. He called on the Philippine government to conduct space monitoring, engage in diplomatic efforts, and take congressional action to protect the Province of Palawan, the West Philippine Sea, and the national dignity. Moreover, he said that Congress should reaffirm its commitment to protect the Filipino people, preserve the country's national heritage, and pursue peaceful cooperation in the region.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ACOSTA

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Acosta to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), the Chair suspended the session at 4:59 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 4:59 p.m., the session was resumed.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE TOLENTINO

Recognized by the Chair upon motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), Representative Tolentino raised an issue which, she said, was not just an environmental concern but a national emergency, in response to the worsening climate crisis in the country. She cited the massive flooding and displacement caused by Typhoons Crising, Dante, and Emong, which destroyed lives and homes and placed her home Province of Cavite in a state of calamity. She emphasized that these disasters are part of a growing pattern, with the country experiencing an average of 20 tropical cyclones a year with increasing intensity and destructive power fueled by the climate crisis. She also highlighted the Philippines' ranking as the most disaster-prone nation in the World Risk Report 2024 and noted that climate-related disasters have cost the country over ₱506 billion in the past decade and are still rising.

She lamented the slow and fragmented progress since the 18th Congress declared a climate emergency through House Resolution No. 1377. She stated that she plans to redeclare the climate emergency in the 20th Congress not as a symbolic gesture, but as a renewed call to action. She urged the Body to (1) pass climate-forward legislation, including priority bills on low carbon economy, coastal management, peatland conservation, and climate accountability; (2) champion data-driven and science-based decision-making to ensure risk-responsive climate policies; (3) strengthen the capacity of local government units and national agencies to plan, implement, and monitor effective climate adaptation and mitigation strategies; and (4) institutionalize strong oversight and accountability mechanisms for climate funds allocation, particularly on the possible alignment of public climate spending with the National Climate Change Action Plan. She further pointed out that despite increases in climate-related budget allocations between 2016 and 2023, averaging 7.2 percent in the national budget, it is insufficient to support a whole-of-government response.

Representative Tolentino warned that every storm, flood, and drought is a deadly reminder of the cost of inaction, disproportionately affecting the poorest and most vulnerable. As Chairperson of the Committee on Climate Change and as one of the young leaders in the House of Representatives, she then appealed to her colleagues to act on the climate emergency with

urgency and courage to ensure that future generations have a world they could live in, not just survive.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), the Chair recognized Representative Oducado for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ODOCADO

Representative Oducado inquired about the actions that Congress and the government have taken following the climate emergency declaration made during the 18th Congress. Representative Tolentino explained that the 19th Congress passed Republic Act No. 12019, which granted juridical personality and legal capacity to the Board of the Fund responding to climate-related loss and damage. She noted that four priority climate bills reached Third Reading but were not enacted and stated that she plans to refile them in the 20th Congress.

In response to further queries from Representative Oducado, Representative Tolentino affirmed the importance of redeclaring a climate emergency, considering the country's continued exposure to severe and unpredictable weather events such as extreme heat, intensified typhoons, and heavy rainfall, which are all linked to global climate change. She further advised that the House should defer to the Climate Change Commission's expertise in determining appropriate budget allocation earmarked for climate change concerns since the Climate Change Act of 2009 does not specify a funding percentage.

On motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), the Chair recognized Representative Rodriguez (R.) for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE RODRIGUEZ (R.)

As he shared his personal connection to climate advocacy due to the tragic impact of Typhoon Sendong in Cagayan de Oro in 2011, which claimed over 1,200 lives and left hundreds missing, and being one of the authors of the bill declaring a climate emergency during the 18th Congress, Representative Rodriguez emphasized the importance of climate change adaptation and disaster risk mitigation and stressed that disasters are often man-made due to a lack of preparation and environmental neglect. He commended Representative

Tolentino, as Chairperson of the Committee on Climate Change, for prioritizing climate legislation in the 20th Congress and asked her to outline the key bills under consideration.

Representative Tolentino responded that she would be filing four major proposals, which are as follows: 1) the Low Carbon Economy Bill, which aligns with international commitments; 2) the Integrated Coastal Management with Coastal Greenbelts Bill, addressing the country's extensive coastline; 3) the Peatlands Conservation Bill, aimed at protecting carbon-storing wetlands; and 4) the Climate Accountability and Carbon Rights Bill, which seeks to define responsibilities and rights related to carbon emissions.

Representative Rodriguez lauded Representative Tolentino's preparedness and expressed his intent to coauthor the said bills, in recognition of their significance in addressing climate challenges.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE TOLENTINO

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Tolentino and the interpellations thereon to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

EXTENSION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

On successive motions of Representative Uy (D.C.), there being no objection, the Chair approved to extend the Privilege Hour for another 60 minutes and thereafter, recognized Rep. Jose Manuel Tadeo "Chel" I. Diokno for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE DIOKNO

Representative Diokno emphasized the constitutional mandate to promote Filipino as the national language and as a medium of official communication. He pointed out that despite this mandate, Philippine laws remain largely inaccessible to ordinary citizens who are not proficient in the English language. Drawing from his decades of experience in human rights advocacy and his work with the Free Legal Helpdesk, he highlighted how legal concepts such as birth certificate correction, child support, and

labor rights are often misunderstood because they are written in English. He argued that this language barrier hinders access to justice and deepens inequality.

While he admitted the enormous task ahead, he cited neighboring countries such as Indonesia, Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, and Timor-Leste, which use their national languages in their laws, proving that it is feasible and beneficial. He shared that he would be filing the "*Batas sa Sariling Wika*" Bill, which mandates the *Komisyon ng Wikang Filipino* (KWF) to translate within 90 days newly enacted laws, especially those imposing penalties, and within five years into languages spoken by four of the country's largest ethnolinguistic groups, namely Tagalog, Bisaya, Ilokano, and Cebuano, all other existing punitive laws. The proposed measure, he added, would also require the Presidential Communications Office to publish official translations in the *Official Gazette*.

In celebration of *Buwan ng Wika* in August, Representative Diokno then called on his colleagues to support the Bill either as coauthors or cosponsors, stressing that the law should be brought closer to the people through their own language.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE DIOKNO

On motion of Representative Uy (D.C.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Diokno to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Thereupon, upon the request of Representative Bocobo, the Chair recognized the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Rep. Jane T. Castro.

Subsequently, the Chair recognized Rep. Ma. Victoria Co-Pilar to deliver her privilege speech, on motion of Representative Uy (D.C.).

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CO-PILAR

Representative Co-Pilar spoke about a recent viral social media post about a family's traumatic experience

at the East Avenue Medical Center (EAMC) in Quezon City. She relayed that according to the author, her father was admitted for a brain tumor but later died, allegedly due to hospital-acquired pneumonia compounded by delayed and inadequate medical care. Representative Co-Pilar emphasized that the case was not an isolated one but reflected the failures in the country's public health care system and the struggles of countless Filipinos seeking medical help.

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Khonghun relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Dy (F.).

Representative Co-Pilar attributed the issue to systemic problems in public hospitals, including overcrowding, staff shortages, poor sanitation, long queues of patients, and exhausted health workers. She also noted that despite laws requiring additional staffing, the country's doctor-to-patient ratio still falls short of the international standard of 10 for every 10,000.

To address these issues, Representative Co-Pilar stated that she would file a resolution grounded in the Constitution, which mandates the State to protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them. She added that her proposal includes: (1) developing health care facilities in the provinces through better funding, equipment, and staffing; (2) providing stronger incentives such as scholarships, subsidies, and rural bonuses to attract and retain medical professionals; and (3) establishing a stronger system of interconnectivity between hospitals and primary care centers through a unified digital network.

In the end, Representative Co-Pilar stressed that her speech was not meant to condemn EAMC or implicate health workers but to strengthen the system, ensure accountability, and provide the necessary support for medical professionals. She urged her colleagues to support the resolution, pledging that the legislature would prioritize the people's health, rebuild public trust, and work toward a health care system marked by competence, compassion, and accountability.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CO-PILAR

On motion of Representative Uy (D.C.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege

speech of Representative Co-Pilar to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

On motion of Representative Calderon, the Chair recognized Rep. Ustadz Yusop T. Alano to deliver his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ALANO

Representative Alano talked about a missing student from his province who had been accepted into a university in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. He relayed that after submitting documents to the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), the student received a text message allegedly from the same government body, instructing him to return for additional biometrics. He said that the student has since disappeared and remained unreachable, prompting his companions to report to the police.

He then noted that while the case may appear to be an isolated incident, it exposes broader dangers, such as scams involving fake government messages, lack of public awareness among students and workers bound for foreign countries, and potential risks of human trafficking, abduction, or other crimes. He added that if there were any legal cases against the missing student, he must still be found to ensure due process.

Representative Alano called on DFA, the Department of Migrant Workers, the Department of Justice, the National Bureau of Investigation, and the Philippine National Police to immediately conduct a joint investigation to ensure the safe return of the missing student. He emphasized the urgency of the situation, and reminded his colleagues to prioritize the safety of the youth.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ALANO

On motion of Representative Calderon, there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Alano to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Adrian Jay C. Advincula, the Chair recognized Rep. Renee Louise M. Co to avail of the Privilege Hour.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CO (R.L.)

Referencing the recent film *Sunshine*, Representative Co discussed the ongoing crisis of adolescent and unwanted pregnancies. She noted that the movie reflects the real-life experiences of young girls who lack a supportive environment; serves as a cultural indictment, raising the question of why sexuality education and related discussions remain absent from schools and other public spaces; and portrays the stories of thousands of women who undergo perilous illegal abortions and face serious medical risks.

Then emphasizing that adolescent pregnancy is a matter of national concern, with the Philippines among the Asian countries with the highest rates, Representative Co stressed that this issue reflects a systemic failure demanding urgent action. She highlighted that many cases of adolescent and unwanted pregnancies stem from violence and incestuous rape that are often tolerated by a culture of irresponsibility and systemic neglect by the State in providing protection and support for victims. She underscored that the issue is a societal problem that denies young people access to age and developmentally appropriate, community-based, culturally sensitive, and comprehensive adolescent sexuality education.

Representative Co stressed that adolescent pregnancy is preventable but requires strong political will. She therefore proposed mandating comprehensive adolescent sexuality education in all schools; expanding youth access to reproductive health services, counseling, safe and democratic spaces, and clinics; and ensuring protection for survivors of sexual violence, including

free legal assistance, psychosocial care, health services, and safe shelters. She also urged her colleagues to act swiftly on the matter and mentioned that the director of *Sunshine* would be interested in screening the film at the House of Representatives.

RESUMPTION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

With the unanimous consent of the Members, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.), there being no objection, the Chair resumed the Privilege Hour.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Gonzales, the Chair recognized Rep. Javier Miguel Lopez Benitez for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BENITEZ (J.M.)

As the chairperson of the Special Committee on Creative Industries, Representative Benitez stated that a brighter future must be deliberately built through well-planned actions and by investing in the right sectors that can ensure long-term national progress and global relevance.

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Khonghun relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Faustino “Bojie” G. Dy III.

Quoting a recent report at Unilab Education, Inc. by Dr. Cielito Habito, an economist and former Secretary of the Department of Economy, Planning, and Development, about the country’s pressing economic issues in education, health, and industry alignment, Representative Benitez urged the government to invest in creative industries as a viable stopgap that can yield faster economic returns. He thereafter shared his experience as former mayor of Victorias City, Negros Occidental, when they invested in the city’s

traditional visual artists and allowed them to flourish in other mediums through the Department of Trade and Industry’s (DTI) *Malikhaing Pinoy* Program. He sought the Body’s support for the reinstatement of the budget for the said program in 2026. He further stressed the importance of properly allocating the five percent incremental revenue from the value-added tax on digital services, as mandated by the recently enacted Republic Act (R.A.) No. 12023, for the development of creative industries. He also mentioned R.A. No. 11904 or the “Philippine Creative Industries Development Act,” which was approved during the 18th Congress under the chairmanship of former Rep. Christopher “Toff” de Venecia and requires real funding and action.

To support his position, he drew comparison with several other countries in Asia, particularly South Korea, which has successfully invested in intellectual property protection, creative education, and digital content, resulting in billions of dollars in export revenue. Representative Benitez then called on the Body to restore and increase funding for the creative industries, fully implement existing laws, and act as prime movers alongside the private sector and civil society to capitalize on Filipino creativity. He explained that the successes and growing global recognition of Filipino talents across various creative fields, including music, design, culinary arts, film, and the performing arts are evidence of the Philippines’ immense creative potential that would have a significant contribution to the country’s gross domestic product and employment, with projections of even greater impact by 2030.

He commended the efforts of national agencies like DTI, the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority, the Department of Tourism, and the Philippine Creative Industries Development Council in supporting creative professionals through training, global exposure, and policy development, as well as the Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028 and international collaborations, which are helping position the country as a potential regional production hub that will propel the Philippines into the global marketplace. He stressed, however, that this momentum must be matched with (1) strategic investments in cutting-edge technology, infrastructure, and strong local partnerships; (2) elevated quality of Filipino creative products, from fashion and furniture to digital content, through innovation and excellence; and (3) clear, long-term policies that go beyond cultural symbolism to truly empower Filipino creativity. In furtherance thereof, he stated that as the Philippines sets its course to become Asia’s Premier Creative Hub and coincidentally, to assume the ASEAN chairmanship in 2026 and the adoption of the Creative Economy Sustainability Framework in May 2025, the country should start investing in world-class infrastructure in creative economies, advancing technological

adoption, nurturing creatives talents, and forging strong public-private partnerships that would allow industries to compete globally while empowering Filipino creatives locally.

Finally, Representative Benitez called on his fellow lawmakers to support policies, programs, and budgets that uplift the creative sector across the country; pledged to engage deeply in consultations, dialogues, and collaborations with the creative industries stakeholders; and invited his colleagues to celebrate and champion Filipino creativity as a vital contributor to national identity and prosperity.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BENITEZ (J.M.)

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.), there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Benitez to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

At this point, upon the request of Rep. Johanne Monich G. Bautista, the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Deputy Speaker Khonghun; Rep. Nelson S. Legacion; and Rep. Dimszar M. Sali.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Bautista, the Chair recognized Rep. Bryan B. Revilla for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE REVILLA (B.)

Representative Revilla rose to honor the overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) whose courage and struggles, he said, deserve the support of the government through key agencies such as the Department of Migrant Workers, the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), and the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA). While he lauded the significant strides and achievements that have saved lives, protected the rights, and reunited with families of OFWs, he lamented that reality remains, especially for women OFWs who continue to face abuse, exploitation, and indignity.

Citing the *Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas* (BSP) data, he shared that behind the cumulative OFW remittances of more than ₱38 billion in 2024 alone are stories of pain and struggles, especially of women, with abuse cases as recorded by OWWA to be on par with the Philippine National Police's data. He likewise revealed that women OFWs in low-skilled and low-value occupations are often treated

as second-class citizens and are vulnerable to contract violations, neglect, and gender-based violence. He said that they are stark reminders of the systemic injustices that persist against OFWs. He then cited several cases of women OFWs, especially mothers, who have suffered and have been brought back lifeless to the country, while others are still suffering from abuse and neglect across the globe.

Representative Revilla then stated that protection of migrant workers was not merely a labor issue but also a gender issue requiring a holistic and gender-based approach. As chairperson of the Committee on Overseas Workers Affairs, he committed to strengthening safeguards for OFWs through legislative reforms, stricter recruitment regulations, swifter repatriation mechanisms, and a continued focus on restoring dignity to OFWs. He called on his colleagues to unite in the mission of justice so that Filipinos could seek opportunities to work abroad with hope, security, and pride.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE REVILLA (B.)

On motion of Representative Bautista (J.M.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Revilla to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

EXTENSION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Representative Bautista (J.M.), there being no objection, the Body extended the Privilege Hour for another 60 minutes.

At this juncture, Representative Calderon moved to recognize Rep. Elijah Rumbaoa San Fernando to avail of the Privilege Hour.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

Before the Body could act on the motion, the Chair *motu proprio* suspended the session at 4:35 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session was resumed at 4:35 p.m.

Subsequently, on motion of Rep. Ziaur-Rahman "Zia" Alonto Adiong, the Chair recognized Representative San Fernando to deliver his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE SAN FERNANDO

Representative San Fernando spoke about the dynamic and intertwined issues concerning labor and education, and the importance of education in preparing individuals as future workers and becoming capable citizens of society.

Then citing data on the persistently alarming struggles of Filipino workers in asserting their rights, Representative San Fernando emphasized the absence of labor education in school curricula, despite the passage of the “Labor Education Act” in 2021, which institutionalized labor rights education into the formal education system. He pointed out the significant gap between existing labor laws and policies and their actual implementation, as well as the lack of data on workers’ awareness, notwithstanding the country’s legal frameworks and its participation in numerous International Labour Organization conventions. Thus, he underscored the urgent need for a comprehensive, progressive, robust, and accessible labor education program that will proactively empower workers, unionists, and advocates through continuous education on the rights, social safety nets, and the importance of collective action.

As he delved into the need to also safeguard the educators’ welfare, Representative San Fernando brought to the Body’s attention the case of Prof. Jose Mario De Vega, whose tenure was unceremoniously terminated after being informed that his contract had ended following two and a half years of service. He attributed this to the provisions of the Commission on Higher Education’s Manual of Regulations for Private Higher Education (MORPHE). Representative San Fernando highlighted the discrepancy between the Philippine Labor Code’s mandated six-month probationary period and MORPHE’s three-year period. He relayed that the said manual has been widely condemned for practically enabling contractualization and opined that it is a travesty that an agency’s manual could override constitutional guarantees.

Urging his colleagues to take action, Representative San Fernando informed the Body that on behalf of the KAMANGGAGAWA Party-List, he will file a resolution to investigate the MORPHE; and then shared his intention to collaborate with various stakeholders to initiate discussions on integrating labor education into the curricula. Further, he expressed hope that the teaching profession will be accorded the dignity and recognition it rightfully deserves, and called for the protection of both present and future workers.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE SAN FERNANDO

On motion of Representative Calderon, there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative San Fernando to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

At this juncture, upon the request of Rep. Jorge Daniel S. Bocobo, the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Rep. Aniela Bianca D. Tolentino; and Minority Leader Marcelino C. Libanan, and Reps. Christopher Sheen P. Gonzales, Anna Victoria Veloso-Tuazon, and Jose Manuel F. Alba.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Bocobo, the Chair recognized Rep. Ferdinand L. Hernandez to avail of the Privilege Hour.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE HERNANDEZ (F.)

Speaking about a pressing issue concerning the health of his constituents in Region XII, Representative Hernandez first recounted how residents from the different provinces in the region endure the long travel to the Cotabato Regional and Medical Center (CRMC), which stands as the primary and fully functioning hospital in the area. However, he said that CRMC was removed from the jurisdiction of the region due to the creation of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, but thanked the region’s local government units for accommodating patients into their provincial and city hospitals.

He then shared that the SOCCSKSARGEN General Hospital (SGH), which was created by virtue of R.A. No. 11102 which he principally authored, was created as the new regional hospital of Region XII. However, he noted that the facility still lacks the proper infrastructure, equipment, and specialists, and thus criticized the Department of Health (DOH) for moving too slowly in upgrading SGH into a true regional-level facility. He emphasized that many critical patients continue to be referred to hospitals in Davao and Tagum, while others are forced to seek treatment in costly private hospitals, which drain funds from the Medical Assistance for Indigent Program and the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations. He also cited alarming statistics including a 42 percent rise in deaths in the region between 2011 and 2020, as well as high maternal and infant mortality rates, as proof that inadequate facilities cost lives.

As Representative Hernandez highlighted that the absence of a functional regional hospital constitutes a violation of both constitutional and human rights, he therefore called on (1) DOH to prioritize the full upgrading of SGH, (2) the Department of Budget and Management to allocate sufficient funding, and (3) the national leadership to fulfill its commitment to prioritize healthcare. He then appealed to the Body to act with urgency and to affirm their constitutional duty as public servants, that is, to protect the lives and dignity of the people.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE TUAN

Recognized by the Chair upon motion of Representative Bocobo, Representative Tuan thanked Representative Hernandez who, he said, was responsible for the creation of the Third District of South Cotabato and consequently paved the way for him to become a Member of the House of Representatives.

As the first elected Representative of the Third District of South Cotabato, he expressed his full support and concurrence on the creation of a regional medical center (RMC) to serve the medical health needs of the people of Region XII as he confirmed that its inadequate medical services force residents to travel to the nearby region with more advanced and adequate medical and health services. Representative Tuan gave his assurance to work closely with Representative Hernandez towards the establishment of RMC for Region XII by elevating the facilities of the South Cotabato General Hospital in Surallah, South Cotabato, not because the proposed medical center will be located in his district but more importantly, because health is the second most important issue for the indigenous people in his region, with education being the first.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE HERNANDEZ

On motion of Representative Bocobo, there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Hernandez and the manifestation thereon to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

EXTENSION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Representative Adiong, there being no objection, the Chair approved to extend the Privilege Hour for another 60 minutes.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Upon the request of Rep. Eduardo R. Rama, the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session

Hall of the guests of Reps. Antonio L. Tinio and Renee Louise M. Co.

Likewise, upon the request of Representative Advincula, the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Representative Hernandez

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE RODRIGUEZ (M.)

Recognized by the Chair upon motion of Representative Santos (M.A.), Rep. Maximo B. Rodriguez Jr. focused his privilege speech on the Mindanao Railway Project (MRP) whose completion, he said, could redefine his province's economic destiny.

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Dy (F.) relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Khonghun.

He underscored that MRP would have been a game-changer that would provide Mindanao with the same modern mobility that Luzon has long enjoyed. After recalling how the project was kept in abeyance numerous times across several administrations until its eventual suspension, Representative Rodriguez shared that in 2014, several House Bills have been filed creating the Mindanao Railway Corporation or Mindanao Railway Authority, including the one that he coauthored with Rep. Rufus B. Rodriguez. He said that MRP was declared a flagship project under the Build, Build, Build Program of the past administration, approved by the former National Economic and Development Authority with funding from China's official development assistance, but was withdrawn due to lack of progress.

He disclosed that the Department of Transportation has recently finalized a redesign project, the government is pursuing a public-private partnership (PPP) model despite major setbacks, and the Mindanao Development Authority (MinDA) remains committed to implementing the MRP. He opined that the project may have undergone multiple feasibility studies, but it needed political support and funding for it to materialize. He lamented the prolonged delays the project has suffered over the decades, warning that each year of inaction results in lost opportunities for progress in the region. Highlighting the absence of a definite implementation timeline as confirmed by MinDA officials, he called for concrete and immediate steps to push the project forward.

Representative Rodriguez, on behalf of ABAMIN Party-List, then called on the Body to (1) support the prompt completion of updated feasibility and design studies, (2) allocate sufficient funds

for the project in the 2026 General Appropriations Act to jumpstart both PPP and government-led construction models, (3) mandate project monitoring to ensure world-class standards and responsiveness to community concerns, and (4) provide transparent and time-bound roadmaps for the Mindanao railway segments. Representative Rodriguez concluded his speech by appealing for equitable development and asserting that the railway represents a long-overdue promise to the people of Mindanao.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE RODRIGUEZ (M.)

On motion of Representative Santos (M.A.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Rodriguez to the Committee on Rules.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), the Chair next recognized Representative Legacion for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE LEGACION

Representative Legacion expressed concern about the growing threat of online gambling in the Philippines and emphasized its widespread accessibility and deeply harmful effects on individuals and families. He described how online gambling has infiltrated homes and communities, leading to financial ruin, family breakdowns, and mental health issues, often affecting vulnerable sectors such as students and low-income earners. He highlighted the aggressive and pervasive nature of online gambling advertisements, which are especially harmful to youth and are glamorized by endorsements of celebrities.

Citing the World Health Organization's classification of gambling addiction as a disorder and pointing to regulatory actions taken by countries like the United Kingdom, Spain, and Australia, Representative Legacion stressed the need for urgent legislative intervention. While recognizing efforts from the Executive branch, including the BSP regulations and the Department of the Interior and Local Government directives, he maintained that these are insufficient, particularly against foreign-based online gaming platforms.

He then called for the total prohibition of all forms of advertising, promotion, and sponsorship related to online gambling in the Philippines to sever the link between aggressive marketing and vulnerable individuals, especially the youth. He urged the Body to

support the passage of his proposed measure to protect public welfare, asserting that the rights and well-being of Filipinos must take precedence over commercial interests.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE LEGACION

On motion of Representative Gonzales (A.M.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Legacion to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

At this point, upon the request of Rep. John Geesnell "Baba" Yap, the Chair acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Rep. Shirley L. Bañas-Nogralas.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BARZAGA

Recognized by the Chair upon motion of Representative Yap (J.G.), Rep. Francisco "Kiko" A. Barzaga raised the issue of the increasing population of stray cats and dogs in communities, the solution of which, he said, is his advocacy for the implementation of more affordable veterinary services and initiatives aimed at controlling the stray animal population, such as spay and neuter programs.

Despite challenges like limited funding and a shortage of veterinarians, he cited the positive results of such programs in Dasmariñas City which is part of the district he represents, and expressed hope for their replication nationwide. He also noted the growing public interest, particularly among the youth, in fostering a compassionate society toward stray animals and encouraged support from fellow Members.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BARZAGA

On motion of Representative Yap (J.G.), there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the privilege speech of Representative Barzaga to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Adiong, the Chair next recognized Rep. Nathaniel M. Oducado for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ODOCADO

Representative Oducado addressed the persistent and devastating issue of flooding in the country,

describing the same as both a socioeconomic crisis and a national security concern. He highlighted the human toll of floods, wherein workers lose income, students miss school, and families suffer from disease and displacement. Drawing from personal experiences during Typhoons Ondoy and Glenda, he emphasized that the real cost of flooding goes beyond water damage, affecting livelihoods and deepening poverty, further intensified by climate change, and thus, making floods more frequent and severe. He pointed out that despite increasing budgets for flood control, many projects fall short due to poor execution, lack of maintenance, and corruption. He criticized the fragmented governance structure, where responsibilities are scattered across various agencies, leading to inefficiencies and gaps in coordination.

To address the flood problem, Representative Oducado proposed the creation of a Presidential Flood Management Commission composed of government officials, civil society organizations, and subject matter experts. He stressed that the proposed commission would develop a long-term, comprehensive national flood management plan with centralized data and clear accountability. He called for a shift from reactive spending to strategic investment, integrating environmental and urban planning reforms. He then urged his colleagues to act decisively, not just to protect infrastructure, but to safeguard Filipino homes and futures, reminding them that now is the time to do what is right.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ODOCADO

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Bautista (J.M.), there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Oducado to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Acosta, the Chair recognized Rep. Joseph S. Tan for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE TAN (J.)

Speaking in Filipino and in celebration of *Buwan ng Wika*, Representative Tan emphasized the importance of the Filipino language as a symbol of national identity, unity, and dignity. He honored historical figures like Manuel L. Quezon, Andres Bonifacio, and Jose Rizal, who used the native language to inspire patriotism and social change. He expressed concern, however, over the continued use of foreign languages in teaching subjects like Science and Mathematics, which he

believes alienates many Filipino students, not because of a lack of intelligence, but because of linguistic barriers. He argued that for inclusive development, the Filipino language must bridge knowledge across all sectors in education, governance, commerce, law, and technology.

Thereupon, Representative Tan called on Congress to lead by example by drafting laws in Filipino and ensuring that government programs and policies are communicated in a language accessible and comprehensible to all. He stressed that the Filipino language should not be confined to poetry and history but must evolve as the language of progress and innovation. He advocated for multilingualism while asserting that the Filipino language must always hold a central place in national discourse. He urged his colleagues to embrace the Filipino language in all aspects of national life, asserting that the language is alive, dynamic, and capable of propelling the country toward a modern and inclusive future.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE TAN (J.)

On motion of Representative Acosta, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Tan to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

TERMINATION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

Thereafter, on further motion of Representative Acosta, there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.

APPROVAL OF JOURNAL NO. 6

Considering that copies of *Journal No. 6* dated August 11 to 13, 2025 were already distributed to the Members, on motion of Rep. Ramon Rodrigo L. Gutierrez, there being no objection, the Body dispensed with the reading thereof and subsequently approved the said Journal.

ADOPTION OF HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

Whereupon, on motion of Representative Advincula, there being no objection, the Body considered House Resolution No. 145, titled: HOUSE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COMMITTEES ON PUBLIC ACCOUNTS, PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS AND GOOD GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY, TO CONDUCT A JOINT INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS, PARTICULARLY FLOOD CONTROL PROJECTS UNDERTAKEN BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS AND OTHER RELATED AGENCIES; and dispensed with the reading of the text of the Resolution without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House, as copies thereof had been distributed to the Members.

MOTION TO ADOPT HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 145

Representative Advincula then moved for the adoption of House Resolution No. 145.

OBJECTION OF REPRESENTATIVE DE LIMA

At this point, Rep. Leila M. De Lima sought recognition from the Chair to manifest her objection to the adoption of House Resolution No. 145. She stated that it would not be prudent for the Body to proceed, as it could entail a possible conflict of interest given the speculations about certain Members' involvement in the flood control projects controversy, and thus, would affect the integrity of the House. She therefore sought the deferment of the Resolution's consideration to afford the majority of the Members of the House more time to study such an important matter.

The Chair noted Representative De Lima's objection.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ADIONG

Representative Adiong stated that the motion was merely to adopt the Resolution with Members voting through *ayes* and *nays*, without the need for individual explanations.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE DE LIMA

Representative De Lima thereafter reiterated her earlier request to defer the consideration of the Resolution in question to afford the Members sufficient time to weigh in on the issue of propriety, wisdom, and prudence of the House investigating itself which, she said, could invoke possible issues of conflict of interest and conspiracy. She then questioned the absence of the majority of the Members in the Session Hall who would vote on the matter at hand.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Representative Adiong, the Chair suspended the session at 6:24 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session was resumed at 6:32 p.m.

On motion of Representative Adiong, the Chair recognized anew Representative De Lima for her manifestation.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE DE LIMA

Representative De Lima stated that certain procedural matters had been explained to her during the break, informing her that she could address the issues when the House Tri-Committee convenes. She yielded to the Body whether to proceed to adopt the Resolution in question; however, she clarified that she was not withdrawing her earlier objection.

ADOPTION OF HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 145

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Advincula, there being no objection, the Body unanimously adopted House Resolution No. 145 through *viva voce* voting.

ADOPTION OF HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 146

Thereafter, on successive motions of Representative Advincula, there being no objection, the Body proceeded to the consideration of House Resolution

No. 146, titled: RESOLUTION ADOPTING AND IMPLEMENTING ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY POLICIES FOR THE INTERNAL OPERATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES; dispensed with the reading of the text of the Resolution without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House as copies thereof had been distributed to the Members; and unanimously adopted the same through *viva voce* voting.
